

### New book on the history of Wicklow RNLI

'All Clear, Let'er Go' by Ciarán Doyle, traces the history of Wicklow Lifeboat Station from its humble beginnings in 1857 to the present day.

It provides the story of the significant events within that almost 160 year history; the rescues, the Lifeboat boats and, of course, the volunteer men and women who worked tirelessly over the years to keep the station operating.

The reader will experience the rigours faced by the 'iron men' in 'wooden' ships as they headed out to sea, open to nature's fury, with nothing to rely upon but their skills and fortitude.

The contents of 'All Clear, let 'er Go' have been gleaned through years of painstaking research, talking with some of the people who were there, and of the author, with over 30 years as a lifeboat crew volunteer.

With the aid of 120 photographs and written in a relaxed style, it will appeal to both the skilled mariner and land lubber alike.
